CONTEXT

India has been pioneering scalable solutions in food security, nutrition, and supply chain. These solutions, including the Grain ATM (Annapurti), Smart Warehouses, Supply Chains Optimisation, Learning Management Systems, and Rice Fortification, have had significant impacts on the country's food-based safety net programmes, bolstering national food and nutrition security. Innovations developed by WFP India in collaboration with Government of India, offer models that can be adopted by other nations to help them achieve Sustainable Development Goal 2 – Zero Hunger.

The exhibition will showcase WFP India's success in advancing the 'Changing Lives' agenda as an enabler to enhance national systems through technical assistance and country capacity strengthening by highlighting its partnership with India. It will also feature testimonials from government counterparts of countries having partnered with India through SouthSouth and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC).

The event will foster knowledge exchange among governments and within the WFP system, It is also expected to inspire future partnerships to adapt these innovations in new regions and countries.

OBJECTIVES

- Demonstrate solutions and innovations in food security and nutrition, developed by the Government of India in partnership with WFP, for a global audience.
- Foster knowledge exchange through SSTC and within the WFP system by showcasing practical, scalable solutions and exploring their potential to be replicated in similar contexts.
- Highlight successful SSTC examples through testimonials from government in partner countries where the innovations have been adopted or are under consideration.
- Showcase WFP's "Changing Lives" agenda, from India, focusing on nutrition and social protection.
